

From the Pastor's Desk


The story of Abraham's attempted sacrifice of Isaac has puzzled Jews and non-believers. Why would a good God ask a father to sacrifice his own son? Jewish scholars in both the Biblical and post-Biblical era have tried to find a reasonable explanation for this.

The answer is provided in the life of Jesus. God the Father offers His Son to the world as an expression of His love for us. Abraham offers his son whom he loves as an expression of his love for God. God the Father doesn't demand Jesus' death. He only requires perfect obedience from His Son. However, the Father knows that the world will reject His Son and put Him to death.

In Isaac's case, God stops Abraham from going through the sacrifice because he has demonstrated his faithfulness to God. In Jesus' case, the Father allows human beings to kill His Son because He respects our freedom and because He knows that Jesus' death will conquer death.

Like Abraham and Jesus, we strive to be perfectly obedient to God during Lent. Now is the time to get rid of anything that hinders us from this. God offers perfect love to us, and the only fitting response is for us to be lovingly obedient.



Memorial of St. Gregory, February 27th

Pope Francis decreed that **St. Gregory of Narek (950-1005)** be added to the General Roman Calendar. St Gregory of Narek, Doctor of the Church, Armenian monk, poet, mystical philosopher, theologian, writer and saint of the Armenian Apostolic Church and Catholic Church was born into a family of writers. Based in the monastery of Narek (Narekavank), he was "Armenia's first great poet" and as "the watchful angel in human form".

St. Gregory of Narek was canonized and proclaimed a Doctor of the Universal Church on April 12, 2015 by Pope Francis. On February 2, 2021, his optional memorial was inscribed on the General Roman Calendar for February 27.
